## Summary of Changes from the 2003 Legislative Session

Following is a partial list of significant legislation from the 2003 Legislative Session affecting the Nevada State Contractors Board and licensed contractors. The bills listed have been signed into law (chaptered) and become effective as noted. Assembly Bill 190 Effective October 1, 2003

AB 190 revises the circumstances in which construction fraud occurs; clarifies the circumstances in which the Executive Officer of the State Contractors Board may seek a cease and desist order; revises the circumstances in which the State Contractors Board may require a licensed contractor to post a bond for wages; provides that the State Contractors Board may suspend the license of a licensee who is prohibited from being awarded a contract for a public work and revises and clarifies the circumstances in which the State Contractors Board may take disciplinary action against a licensee.

### Assembly Bill 220 Effective June 9, 2003

AB 220 expands the authority of the Board to require a contractor to establish financial responsibility under certain circumstances; provides for the confidentiality of information complied as a result of an investigation conducted by the State Contractors Board: authorizes the Board to conduct a background investigation of an applicant for employment with the Board; prohibits the Board from issuing a

private reprimand to a licensee; authorizes a district court in a proceeding for a judicial review of a final decision of the Board to dismiss an agency or person from the proceeding under certain circumstances; and establishes diversion of funds from a construction project as a criminal offense.

### Assembly Bill 262 Effective July 1, 2003

AB 262 provides for the inspection of, and the issuance of certificates of occupancy for, factory-built housing and manufactured buildings by the Manufactured Housing Division of the Department of Business and Industry in certain counties under certain circumstances; authorizes the Division to establish certain fees; provides for the classification of mobile, manufactured or factory-built homes on leased land as real property for purposes of property taxes under certain circumstances; establishes liability for the unlawful removal of a mobile or manufactured home which has been converted to real property; authorizes certain dealers of new manufactured homes to contract with licensed providers of services to perform work pertinent to the sale, installation and occupancy of manufactured homes; revises provisions governing the licensure of limited servicemen who provide services relating to the installation and repair of manufactured homes; and clarifies the applicability of certain statutory provisions regarding deceptive trade practices to a mobile or manufactured home.

### Senate Bill 206 Effective Oct. 1, 2003

SB 206 relates to liens. It prohibits the waiver or modification of rights relating to mechanics' and materialmen's liens except under certain circumstances; prohibits certain provisions in a contract for a work of improvement; and makes various changes to the provisions relating to mechanics' and materialmen's liens.

### Senate Bill 241 Effective Aug. 1, 2003

SB 241 requires notice, a right to inspect, and a right to repair to be provided a contractor before an action for constructional defects may be commenced; establishes the State Contractors Board as a resource to answer questions and assist in resolving disputes concerning matters which may affect or relate to constructional defects; and makes varioius other changes



concerning constructional defects.

Senate Bill 250 Effective July 1, 2003

SB 250 enacts certain provisions that are applicable to all regulatory bodies that regulate occupations or professions in title 54 of NRS; provides that certain records of a regulatory body are public records; revises provisions relating to certain consent and settlement agreements; and enacts provisions relating to attorney fees and costs.



SB 310 clarifies that certain occupational boards and commissions must act in the public interest; revises the

qualifications for the members of certain occupational boards and commissions; provides that the members of certain occupational

boards and commissions must be provided with certain materials and training upon appointment; revises the authority of certain occupational boards and commissions to hire employees or contract with independent contractors; and revises the qualifications for executive director or executive secretary of certain occupational boards and commissions.

Senate Bill 437 Effective May 26, 2003

SB 437 requires construction managers or pool consultants to have a contractor's license; and clarifies certain provisions that prohibit contractors from acting as owners of certain companies, corporations and business entities, providing penalties.






## Attorney Richard Peel Delivers with Free Legal Seminar for Licensed Contractors

### Loan Your License, Lose Your License

License Loaning is the Most Serious of Contractor Violations By George Lyford, Director of Investigations

A Nevada State Contractor's License is a valuable accomplishment, one that can be a source of pride. Not only is it a sign of a true industry professional, it provides a living for many throughout our state who build and repair the structures in which we all trust for our families.

As a contractor, you know that obtaining a contractor's license is no easy task. Continued success requires references, establishment of financial responsibility, passing trade and law tests, obtaining insurance, establishing a business, assuming responsibility for the actions and work of employees, and establishing good character and reputation in the community.

However, there are some contractors who do not have a clear understanding of licensing laws and others who attempt to work around them. This can result in the lending of a contractor's license to friends, family, business associates or other unlicensed individuals and places that contractor's livelihood in jeopardy.

Allowing anyone else to use your license to submit bids, pull permits, advertise, or perform work can result in loss of your license. It is simply not acceptable to permit someone to use your license even if they have a license pending or if it is "only a little job." There are no exceptions to the law.

The Nevada Revised Statute 624.305 provides for the automatic revocation of a license that is used by any other person than the person to whom it is issued. The loaning of a license is the most serious violation a contractor can commit and will result in the automatic loss of the license.

Protect your livelihood and your family. Don't loan your license.

### Allegation Period Helps Contractors, Homeowners

A new allegation period implemented by the NSCB is helping contractors maintain a clean complaint record. The 14-day period allows would-be complaints to be resolved without a scar on the contractor's record by resolving issues through mediation.

When a workmanship or money-owing grievance comes in to the Board from a homeowner or supplier, it is now initially registered as an allegation. A call is made by a Board representative to both parties informing them that there is an issue to be resolved and that there are 14 days to resolve it before it becomes a formal complaint. Upon receipt of a call from the complainant informing the Board that the issue has been resolved, the allegation is closed and does not appear anywhere.

The allegation period has proven to be a win-win approach to resolving issues with contractors. The contractor has the opportunity to rectify any situation before it becomes a full-fledged complaint and can maintain a good record. The homeowner has a forum to voice concerns and get issues addressed in a timely manner.

According to Deputy Director of Investigations, Chris Denning, the process also helps to lighten the considerable caseloads of Board investigators.

Contractors and homeowners alike appreciate the level of personal service that makes this program work. "I check back with them (both parties) regularly to make sure everything is going okay throughout the whole two-week process." Charlene Fitzharris, a board representative involved with the allegation process, remarks on its effectiveness and how all parties involved are praising its success.

### Residential Recovery Fund

The 1999 Legislature enacted legislation establishing the Residential Recovery Fund, to reimburse homeowners who have been financially damaged by errant contractors. The law requires all residential contractors to contribute to the fund and also requires all residential contractors to provide a written notice to homeowners in compliance with NRS 624.520

The written statement must be in substantially the following form:

### RESIDENTIAL CONSTRUCTION RECOVERY FUND

Payment may be available from the recovery fund if you are damaged financially by a project performed on your residence pursuant to a contract, including construction, remodeling, repair or other improvements, and the damage resulted from certain specified violations of Nevada law by a contractor licensed in this state. To obtain information relating to the recovery fund, you may contact the State Contractors Board at the following locations:

The Board may impose an administrative fine of \$100.00 for the first offense and \$25,000 for the second or subsequent offense on the contractor for failing to give appropriate notice.

To assist in compliance with the above statute, residential contractors may provide the above disclosure when the bid or proposal is submitted, when it is signed, at the time of walk-thru, at closing or when the project is completed.

No matter which way you look in Nevada, there are sure signs of a winner. It has been that way for a good long time. Young Electric Sign Company, YESCO, licensed contractor since 1945 and provider of quality signs since 1920, is a key player in shaping the Las Vegas and Reno cityscapes as well as those of many others throughout the country.

Young Electric Sign is the company that brought us Vegas Vic, the Hard Rock Guitar, the innovative flickering neon sign atop the Mint and so much more.

Young Electric Sign is very much a family business. It was founded by accomplished sign artist, Thomas Young, was run by his son, Thomas Young, Jr., and is now in the capable hands of his grandchildren. The YESCO family

doesn't stop there; it includes each of many loyal employees that are proud to be a part of a tradition of quality. It reflects another tradition, which is to treat each individual as the important member that they are to the YESCO family.

On March 20, 1920 with a \$300 loan from his father, Young opened his own sign business in Ogden, Utah. He later changed the name to Young Electric Sign Company. By 1929, he had hired 27 full-time employees.

The Roaring Twenties brought neon. When neon became available, companies were doing good business and needed the flashy new signs to attract customers. Later, during the Depression YESCO's business continued to grow as movie theaters around the country were popular. Signs from Young were springing up all around the western landscape.

By the early 1930's Young Electric Sign Company became one of the first sign companies in the region to manufacture neon tubing. Many businesses throughout the West benefited from this technology. By 1932, YESCO began servicing a remote railroad stop where gambling had been made legal Las Vegas.

After having opened a branch office in Las Vegas in 1945, Tomas Young designed the Boulder Club sign, the first neon spectacular sign in Las Vegas. It started a frenzy among club owners for bigger and more fantastic signs. Las Vegas exploded into "the most razzle-dazzle city in the world."

Plastic was the rage in the 60's. It offered a new medium for sign

makers limited only by the imagination of talented artists. This versatile material nearly took over the demand for neon.

Tom Jr. took over Young Electric Sign in 1969 and promised to grow and prosper his father's business. The company expanded to eight branch offices and 300 employees. Two years later, Thomas Young passed away.

The eighties saw the installation of the first of many massive, four

color electronic message centers like the one at Caesar's Palace, as well as more and more challenging, multifaceted designs. YESCO acquired its first computerized cutting machine in 1986, ensuring its craftspeople the latest, cutting edge technology with which to design.

In 1988, Michael T. Young was elected president of YESCO, Paul Young was elected executive vice-president and



Jeff Young was elected vice-president and secretary. Mike, Paul and Jeff had taken up where their father had left off.

Among Young Electric Sign's modern triumphs are the four-block long canopy and graphic display system that contains the Fremont Street Experience in downtown Las Vegas, being selected as the official signage vendor of the Salt Lake City Olympic Winter Games, creating the "message globe" at NBC in New York City and the list goes on and on.



Tom Young Sr. was elected to the Gaming Hall of Fame, joining an impressive list of business people and entertainers like Donald Trump, Frank Sinatra and Siegfried & Roy. 

### Fire Safety in the Workplace

### **Excerpts from OSHA Guidelines for Construction**

OSHA guidelines for fire safety in the workplace include but are not limited to the following considerations. Employers should train workers about fire hazards in the workplace and about what to do in a fire emergency. If you want your workers to evacuate, you should train them on how to escape. If you expect your workers to use firefighting equipment, you should give them appropriate equipment and train them to use equipment safely.

Every workplace must have enough exits suitably located to enable everyone to get out of the facility quickly. Considerations include the type of structure, the number of persons exposed, the fire protection available, the type of industry involved, and the height and type of construction of the building or structure. In addition, fire doors must not be blocked or locked when employees are inside. Delayed opening of fire doors, however is permitted when an approved alarm system is integrated into the fire door design. Exit routes from buildings must be free of obstructions and properly marked with exit signs.

Not every employer is required to have an emergency action plan. When required, employers must develop emergency action plans that:

- Describe the routes for workers to use and procedures to
- Account for all evacuated employees.
- Remain available for employee review.
- Include procedures for evacuating disabled employees
- Address evacuation of employees who stay behind to shut down equipment
  - Include preferred means of alerting employees to a fire emergency.
  - Provide for an employee alarm system throughout the workplace.
  - Require an alarm system that includes voice communication or sound signals such as bells, whistles or horns.
  - Make the evacuation signal known to employees.
  - Ensure emergency training.
  - Require employer review of the plan with new employees and with all employees whenever the

plan is changed.
