CONTRACTORS BOARD TAKES DISCIPLINARY ACTION AGAINST TWO CONTRACTORS

(*Reno, NV*) - At its meeting on February 10, 2004, the Nevada State Contractors Board adjudicated cases against two (2) licensed contractors.

Western Design and Building, license number 15110 (Residential and Small Commercial) based out of Gardnerville, Nevada was found in violation of Nevada Revised Statute 624 for substandard workmanship, failure to establish financial responsibility; acting in the capacity of a contractor beyond the scope of the license; and willful departure from plans or specifications. The licensee was assessed the cost of investigation.

Mountain High Landscape, license number 51052 (Landscape Contracting) of Las Carson City, Nevada was found in violation of Nevada Revised Statute 624 for substandard workmanship; failure to keep records and maintain bond; and failure to comply with a written request of the Board. The Board revoked the license of Mountain High Landscape.

Summary Suspension

Aspen Construction, license number 31011 (Residential and Small Commercial) based out of Reno, Nevada, was summarily suspended by the Nevada State Contractors Board for the health, safety and welfare of the public.

The Board acted under a provision of the Nevada revised Statutes (NRS) 624.291, which gives the Board authority to suspend the license of a contractor without a hearing if the board finds, based upon evidence in its possession, that the public health, safety or welfare imperatively requires summary suspension of the license.

The Nevada State Contractors Board is committed to protecting the public's health, safety, and welfare through licensing and regulation of the construction industry. Under Nevada Revised Statutes, a licensee is subject to disciplinary action by the Board for failure to comply with the requirements of the laws or regulations governing contractors. Violations may result in Board action against the contractor's license. The State Contractors Board has the power to regulate contractors and discipline licensees who violate NRS 624. Disciplinary action may consist of a fine of up to \$10,000 per offense, order corrective action, suspension, revocation or other action.
