## <u>CONTRACTORS BOARD TAKES DISCIPLINARY ACTION</u> <u>AGAINST SPEEDY PLUMBING & AIR</u>

At its meeting on June 24, 2005, the Nevada State Contractors Board adjudicated a case involving All

American Service Corp. dba Speedy Plumbing & Air.

*All American Service Corp. dba Speedy Plumbing & Air*, license numbers 54199 and 53962 based out of Las Vegas, Nevada was found in violation of Nevada Revised Statute 624 for diversion of money or property; willful disregard of building laws; acting in the capacity of a contractor beyond the scope of the license; abandonment of a construction project; failure to execute a construction project; failure to cooperate in the investigation of a complaint; failure to comply with a written request from the Board; failure to establish financial responsibility; failure to provide required Residential Recovery Fund disclosures with a residential contract; failure to report to the Board a change in address or personnel; failure to comply with a notice to correct; combining with an unlicensed person to perform an unauthorized act; a fraudulent or deceitful act in the capacity of a contractor; misrepresentation of a material fact; and failure to report a change in officers or directors. The Board suspended the licenses of All American Service Corp. dba Speedy Plumbing & Air. The licensee was fined \$14,750, assessed the cost of investigation, ordered to pay restitution to homeowners, continue a Business Review,\* submit a financial statement and re-take and pass the contractor license examinations.

\*The Business Review Program is one in which contractor's business practices and regulatory compliance is examined by NSCB investigative staff. The program is a part of NSCB's proactive investigative efforts.

The Nevada State Contractors Board is committed to protecting the public's health, safety, and welfare through licensing and regulation of the construction industry. Under Nevada Revised Statutes, a licensee is subject to disciplinary action by the Board for failure to comply with the requirements of the laws or regulations governing contractors. Violations may result in Board action against the contractor's license. The State Contractors Board has the power to regulate contractors and discipline licensees who violate NRS 624. Disciplinary action may consist of a fine of up to \$10,000 per offense, order corrective action, suspension, revocation or other action.
