## CONTRACTORS BOARD TAKES DISCIPLINARY ACTION AGAINST TWO CONTRACTORS

(Reno, NV) - At its meeting on October 7, 2003, the Nevada State Contractors Board adjudicated cases against two (2) licensed contractors.

Nevada Painting, license number 49275 (Painting and Decorating) based out of Minden, Nevada was found in violation of Nevada Revised Statute 624 for combining or conspiring with an unlicensed person to commit an unauthorized act; failure to keep required records; and failure to comply with the regulations of the Board. Licensee was fined $\$ 1500$ and assessed the cost of investigation.

PK Alley, license number 36543 (Residential and Small Commercial) based out of Reno, Nevada was found in violation of Nevada Revised Statute 624 for substandard workmanship; failure to comply with a notice to correct; bidding in excess of established license limit; failure to provide required disclosures; and acting in the capacity of a contractor beyond the scope of the license. The licensee was given 90 days to complete the project or license will be revoked.

[^0]:    The Nevada State Contractors Board is committed to protecting the public's health, safety, and welfare through licensing and regulation of the construction industry. Under Nevada Revised Statutes, a licensee is subject to disciplinary action by the Board for failure to comply with the requirements of the laws or regulations governing contractors. Violations may result in Board action against the contractor's license. The State Contractors Board has the power to regulate contractors and discipline licensees who violate NRS 624. Disciplinary action may consist of a fine of up to $\$ 10,000$ per offense, order corrective action, suspension, revocation or other action.
