#### 9. EXECUTIVE SESSION

Executive Officer's Report

Ms. Grein informed the Board that she will be participating in a Legislator Meet and Greet opportunity for all Boards on February 15, 2019, at the Legislative Office Building in Carson City.

· Review of Monthly Department Statistics

Ms. Grein provided the following statistics for the month of July:

- Licensing Department:
  - Received 139 new license applications and 242 change applications;
  - Issued 120 new licenses;
  - · Approved 76 Financial Reviews;
  - Approved 664 inactive and active license renewal applications;
  - Issued or renewed 31 Certificates of Eligibility; and
  - Held two Business Assistance Programs with 36 participants.
- Investigations Department:
  - Opened a total of 229 complaints, including 136 compliance and 93 criminal complaints;
  - Held 11 Disciplinary Hearings, where 6 licenses were revoked and 4 were suspended.
  - A total of \$27,800 in fines and \$18,593 in investigative costs were assessed, and \$24,622 in restitution was ordered by the Board; and

- 37 court filings were issued seeking prosecution for 34 misdemeanor charges and 3 Gross Misdemeanor charges, and 5 felony charges against the alleged suspects.
- Also during July, 4 Recovery Fund claims were opened. The Recovery Fund Subcommittee met and heard 2 claims, awarding \$18,414.50 to one claimant and denying the other.
- Additionally, the Board hosted a Legislator Meet and Greet with Dale Atkinson of FARB, which
  provided legislators with an overview of the role of occupational licensing Boards.
- Members and Board staff also participated in the annual Comprehensive Regulatory Training by Dale Atkinson, which was held at the Reno office.
- Board management participated in a monthly training focused on Building and Strengthening Workplace Relationships;
- Board staff met with members of PHCC and SNARSCA in a roundtable discussion;
- Board staff gave a presentation to the contracts personnel at NV Energy highlighting the Board's license verification services and other proactive resources.
- The Public Information Office met with the editor of Biz Nevada to discuss upcoming opportunities
  and share information about the Board's services; participated in an interview at the Beasley
  Media Group studios for the Shades of Green radio program; interviewed our first Recovery Fund
  recipient testimonial; and participated in a radio interview with Entercom radio about monsoon
  season.
