Ms. Grein indicated that the notice of the hearing was posted in compliance with NRS 2338 at the Paseo Verde Library, Sawyer State Building, Clark County Library, the Washoe County Courthouse, South Valleys Library, Reno City Hall; offices of the State Contractors Board in Reno and Henderson; on the agency's website and on the State of Nevada Public Notice website, the Nevada Register and mailed to persons who expressed an interest in receiving notice.

Ms. Grein explained the purpose of the hearing is to receive comments from interested parties concerning two proposed regulations identified as LCB file R013-19 and R023-19.

The purpose of R013-19 is to amend Chapter 624 of the Nevada Administrative Code in order to set forth the qualifications for a person serving as a hearing officer to require such a person to: (1) be an attorney in good standing licensed to practice law in this State; (2) have certain experience as an attorney relating to formal hearings or trials in civil actions or administrative proceedings; and (3) either meet certain additional experience requirements or have been a certain type of judicial officer.

The purpose of R023-19 is to amend Chapter 624.590 of the Nevada Administrative Code by expanding the types of experience documentation necessary for an applicant to become a licensed contractor and will add language to NAC 624 to define "employer" and "employee" as those terms are used in the statutes and regulations to remove ambiguity.

Jimmy Lau representing Ferrari Public Affairs was present but did not offer public comment. No written comments were received. Ms. Grein stated that this matter will be considered by the Board at their next board meeting on September 19, 2019. The hearing was adjourned at 9:04 a.m.
