STATE CONTRACTORS BOARD MINUTES OF THE REGULATION WORKSHOP BEFORE THE NEVADA STATE CONTRACTORS BOARD NOVEMBER 9, 2021

1. CALL TO ORDER:

The workshop was called to order at 1:00 p.m. on Tuesday, November 9, 2021 at the offices of the State Contractors Board, 2310 Corporate Circle, Henderson, Nevada and video-conferenced to the Reno office. Exhibit 1 is the notice of Intent to Act Upon a Regulation and copies of the proposed regulations.

Ms. Grein stated the notice of the workshop was posted in compliance with the open meeting law on the Board's Internet Website, the Public Notice Website, both offices of the Nevada State Contractors Board, and e-mailed electronically to persons who have expressed interest in being kept informed of the Board's meetings.

Ms. Grein explained the purpose of the workshop is to receive comments from interested parties concerning proposed regulation identified as LCB file R030-21.

The purpose of R030-21 is to amend Chapter 624 of the Nevada Administrative Code to comply with the provisions of SB 303 which require the agency to adopt by regulation standards for advertisements concerning residential photovoltaic systems used to produce electricity.

Ms. Grein further noted that written comments were received from Michelle Newman of the Office of the Attorney General, Krystal Hosmer of Robco Electric, Inc., Sara Birmingham of the Solar Energy Industries Association, Brian Reeder on behalf of Sunrun, Inc., and Stephen Lassiter of Sunrun, Inc.

Mr. Stephen Lassiter, Senior Manager of Public Policy with Sunrun stated he did not have additional public comment to add to his written submission. However, he did express his concern related to the definition of the word "Material Misrepresentation" and how it is viewed.

Ms. Jessica Ferrato with Crowley & Ferrato Public Affairs, representing the Solar Energy Industries Association, the national trade association on solar, provided testimony related to their commitment to consumer protection and are continuously developing resources designed to safeguard customer rights and

providing stakeholder access to important materials. With a primary concern to protect Nevadans against unprofessional sales tactics and to see solar growth in Nevada, they are in support of these regulations and ask the Board to consider the changes proposed by Sunrun.

Ms. Grein stated that a hearing on the matter will be held November 16, 2021 at 1:00 p.m. at the same locations. The workshop was adjourned at 1:21 p.m.
