BOARD TAKES DISCIPLINARY ACTION AGAINST THREE CONTRACTORS

(*Henderson, NV*) – At its meeting on February 25, 2003, the Nevada State Contractors Board adjudicated cases against three (3) licensed contractors.

-Summary Suspension-

The Island Company, 35356 (Specialty Contractor) based out of Las Vegas, Nevada was summarily suspended by the Nevada State Contractors Board.

The Board acted under a provision of the Nevada revised Statutes (NRS) 624.291 which gives the Board authority to suspend the license of a contractor without a hearing if the board finds, based upon evidence in its possession, that the public health, safety or welfare imperatively requires summary suspension of the license.

Dwellings Construction Co., license number 41699 (Residential and Small Commercial) based out of North Las Vegas, Nevada was found in violation of Nevada Revised Statute 624 for failure to pay for materials or services; failure to keep in force a bond or cash deposit; and, failure to establish financial responsibility. The Board revoked the license of Dwellings Construction Co.

Allied Homes Corporation, license number 46245 (Residential and Small Commercial) based out of Las Vegas, Nevada was found in violation of Nevada Revised Statute 624 for contracting in excess of established license limit; failure to include license number and monetary limit on a contract or proposal; failure to comply with a written request of the Board; commission of a fraudulent or deceitful act; failure to pay a required assessment; failure to notify the Board of the termination of qualified employee. The Board revoked the license of Allied Homes Corporation.

The Nevada State Contractors Board is committed to protecting the public's health, safety, and welfare through licensing and regulation of the construction industry. Under Nevada Revised Statutes, a licensee is subject to disciplinary action by the Board for failure to comply with the requirements of the laws or regulations governing contractors. Violations may result in Board action against the contractor's license. The State Contractors Board has the power to regulate contractors and discipline licensees who violate NRS 624. Disciplinary action may consist of a fine of up to \$10,000 per offense, order corrective action, suspension, revocation or other action.
