CONTRACTORS BOARD TAKES DISCIPLINARY ACTION AGAINST THREE CONTRACTORS

(Reno, NV) - At its meeting on August 1, 2005, the Nevada State Contractors Board adjudicated cases involving three contractors.

Dynamic Diversified Development Enterprises, Inc., license number 25493 (Residential and Small Commercial) based out of Carson City, Nevada was found in violation of Nevada Revised Statute 624 for substandard workmanship; failure to comply with Board's Notice to Correct. The licensee was assessed the cost of investigation and ordered to correct workmanship issues within thirty days.

Superior Overhead Door, Inc., license number 55132 (Overhead Doors) based out of Reno, Nevada was found in violation of Nevada Revised Statute 624 for substandard workmanship; failure to comply with Board's Notice to Correct; failure to cooperate in an investigation; failure to comply with terms of a construction contract; failure to notify owner of Residential Recovery Fund; failure to include license number and monetary license limit on contract; failure to notify the Board of a change of address; and failure to establish financial responsibility. The Board revoked the license of Superior Overhead Door, Inc.

Ram-Builders, Inc., license number 44360 (Residential and Small Commercial) based out of Minden, Nevada was found in violation Two 2 times of Nevada Revised Statute 624 for failure to pay for materials and services; and failure to establish financial responsibility. The Board revoked the license of Ram-Builders, Inc.

The Nevada State Contractors Board is committed to protecting the public's health, safety, and welfare through licensing and regulation of the construction industry. Under Nevada Revised Statutes, a licensee is subject to disciplinary action by the Board for failure to comply with the requirements of the laws or regulations governing contractors. Violations may result in Board action against the contractor's license. The State Contractors Board has the power to regulate contractors and discipline licensees who violate NRS 624. Disciplinary action may consist of a fine of up to \$10,000 per offense, order corrective action, suspension, revocation or other action.
