**CONTRACTORS BOARD TAKES DISCIPLINARY ACTION
INVOLVING TWO CONTRACTORS**

(Henderson, NV) - At its meeting on September 15, 2005, the Nevada State Contractors Board adjudicated cases involving two (2) contractors.

West Coast Framing, LLC, license number 55624 (Carpentry) based out of Las Vegas, Nevada was found in violation of Nevada Revised Statute 624 for committing a fraudulent or deceitful act; failure to establish financial responsibility; failure to comply with a written request from the Board; and failure to report to the Board a change in address or personnel. The Board issued licensee a one year Letter of Reprimand and assessed the cost of investigation.

Pennington Development, Inc., license numbers 45675A (General Building), 45676A (Carpentry) and ***Hunter Mechanical, Inc.*** license numbers 46597 (Refrigeration and Air Conditioning), 50174 (Plumbing and Heating) based out of Las Vegas, Nevada were found in violation of Nevada Revised Statute 624 for substandard workmanship; failure to establish financial responsibility; failure to comply with a written request from the Board; and failure to include license number and monetary limit on a contract or proposal. The Board revoked the license of Pennington Development, Inc and Hunter Mechanical, Inc., and assessed the cost of investigation.

The Nevada State Contractors Board is committed to protecting the public's health, safety, and welfare through licensing and regulation of the construction industry. Under Nevada Revised Statutes, a licensee is subject to disciplinary action by the Board for failure to comply with the requirements of the laws or regulations governing contractors. Violations may result in Board action against the contractor's license. The State Contractors Board has the power to regulate contractors and discipline licensees who violate NRS 624. Disciplinary action may consist of a fine of up to \$10,000 per offense, order corrective action, suspension, revocation or other action.
