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**CONTRACTORS BOARD TAKES DISCIPLINARY ACTION
AGAINST THREE CONTRACTORS**

(Reno, NV.) - At its meeting on Nov. 7, 2005, the Nevada State Contractors Board adjudicated cases involving three contractors.

M H Barnett Construction., license number 28315 (Residential and Small Commercial) based out of Reno, NV., was found in violation of Nevada Revised Statute 624 for acting in the capacity of a contractor beyond the scope of the license; performing construction without obtaining necessary building permits; and failure to establish financial responsibility. The licensee was issued a corrective order, placed on inactive status, and assessed the cost of the investigation.

Creative Design Group., license number 49111 (Residential and Small Commercial) based out of Reno, NV., was found in violation of Nevada Revised Statute 624 for failure to provide required Residential Recovery Fund disclosures; and five counts of failure to pay required Residential Recovery Fund fees. The licensee was ordered to pay into the Residential Recovery Fund and assessed the cost of the investigation.

David L. Edward Fence., license number 42851 (Fencing and Guard Rails) based out of Wadsworth, NV., was found in violation of Nevada Revised Statute 624 for abandonment of a construction project; failure to comply with terms of a construction contract causing material injury to another; failure to respond to a written request from the Board; failure to include license number and monetary limit on contract or proposal; failure to provide required Residential Recovery Fund disclosures; failure to provide disclosures required by a general building contractor; failure to establish financial responsibility; and diversion of money. The licensee was placed on suspension, ordered to pay restitution to all damage parties and assessed the cost of the investigation.

The Nevada State Contractors Board is committed to protecting the public's health, safety, and welfare through licensing and regulation of the construction industry. Under Nevada Revised Statutes, a licensee is subject to disciplinary action by the Board for failure to comply with the requirements of the laws or regulations governing contractors. Violations may result in Board action against the contractor's license. The State Contractors Board has the power to regulate contractors and discipline licensees who violate NRS 624. Disciplinary action may consist of a fine of up to \$10,000 per offense, order corrective action, suspension, revocation or other action.
