## <u>Contractors Board Member David W. Clark</u> Receives Nevada Chapter Associated General Contractors SIR Award





David W. Clark, owner of Janus Land and
Building Co. of Las Vegas and a board member
of the Nevada State Contractors Board since
January 2002, was honored with the Nevada
Chapter Associated General Contractors' SIR

award at its annual meeting in Reno on Feb. 23, 2006. The prestigious award, whose acronym stands for "Skill, Integrity and Responsibility," is given to men, women and organizations that have made outstanding contributions to Nevada, the state's quality of life and the construction industry.

Clark was honored by the AGC for his contributions to the community.

Throughout his career, he has served as a member of: the founding boards for UNLV,

UNR and DRI (Desert Research Institute), the executive committee for St. Jude's Ranch

for Children, Las Vegas Engineering Advisory Board, and the Las Vegas Founder's Club.

"It was very rewarding to receive this award because when you are recognized by your peers, that is the ultimate compliment," Clark said. "I think that it is important that we give back time and money into the community from which we draw our living."

Clark has over 30 years of experience in construction and development and currently has general contractors' licenses in Nevada and California.

Clark praised the AGC for its involvement in communities throughout Nevada and for raising the level of professionalism within the construction business. Ten years ago, he was on the AGC national marketing committee in Washington, D.C., and found the experience very rewarding.

The Nevada Chapter of the AGC originated the SIR award in 1967, which was later adopted by AGC chapters nationwide. Since the award's inception, the Nevada Chapter of the AGC has given out 88 SIR awards.
