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**CONTRACTORS BOARD TAKES DISCIPLINARY ACTION
INVOLVING FOUR CONTRACTORS IN SOUTHERN NEVADA**

(Henderson, NV) - At its meeting on April 19, 2006, the Nevada State Contractors Board adjudicated cases involving four contractors.

Kim Neal Morey, dba Mountain Contracting and Development., license number 50923 (Residential and Small Commercial) based out of Las Vegas, NV, was found in violation of Nevada Revised Statute 624 for substandard workmanship; failure to comply with the Board's Notice to Correct; bidding or contracting beyond the established license limit; and failure to comply with the regulations of the Board. Licensee was fined \$3,500 and assessed the cost of the investigation. Licensee ordered to pay the homeowner \$20,000 within 30 days and pay fines and investigative costs within 90 days, or the license will be revoked.

Neco Lamon Murray, dba Nevada Electrical Co., license number 54851 (Electrical Contracting) based out of Las Vegas, NV, was found in violation of Nevada Revised Statute 624 for contracting with an inactive license; contracting on a name not on the license; acting in the capacity of a contractor beyond the scope of the license; failure to establish financial responsibility; and failure to comply with a written request by the Board. Licensee was fined \$2,200, assessed the cost of investigation and ordered to pay the homeowner \$850 within 30 days and pay the fines and cost of the investigation within 90 days or the license will be revoked.

Majestic One Corp., dba Manufactured Housing Foundations of Nevada, license number 54662 (Piers and Foundations) based out of Pahrump, NV, was found in violation of Nevada Revised Statute 624 for failure to respond to a written request from the Board; misrepresentation of a material fact; failure to pay money due for materials or services; failure to establish financial responsibility; failure to comply with a written request from the Board; and failure to keep in force a cash bond or deposit. Licensee was ordered to pay full restitution to all damaged

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homeowners, reimburse the Residential Recovery Fund and pay investigative costs. The license was revoked.

Las Vegas Valley Signs, license number 51852 (Erecting Signs) based out of Las Vegas, NV, was found in violation of Nevada Revised Statute 624 for misrepresentation of a material fact; failure to respond to a written request from the Board; failure to pay money due for materials or services; failure to establish financial responsibility; failure to comply with a written request from the Board; and failure to keep in force a cash bond or deposit. Licensee was ordered to pay full restitution to all damaged homeowners, reimburse the Residential Recovery Fund and pay investigative costs. The license was revoked.

***The Business Review Program is one in which a contractor's business practices and regulatory compliance is examined by NSCB investigative staff. The program is a part of NSCB's proactive investigative efforts.**

The Nevada State Contractors Board is committed to protecting the public's health, safety, and welfare through licensing and regulation of the construction industry. Under Nevada Revised Statutes, a licensee is subject to disciplinary action by the Board for failure to comply with the requirements of the laws or regulations governing contractors. Violations may result in Board action against the contractor's license. The State Contractors Board has the power to regulate contractors and discipline licensees who violate NRS 624. Disciplinary action may consist of a fine of up to \$10,000 per offense, order corrective action, suspension, revocation or other action.
