## <u>Unlicensed Northern Nevada Contractor Arrested</u> <u>On Kansas Child Pornography Warrant</u>

The Nevada State Contractors Board recently received information of an unlicensed contractor named Michael Packett working in the Reno area, who was also a possible fugitive on child pornography charges in Kansas. The NSCB, working with the Reno Police Department, conducted a sting operation in which Packett submitted a bid for \$1,200 to construct a deck and repair and paint a fence.

Packett, aka John Paul Storey and Wesley T. Story, was arrested by the Reno Police on fugitive child pornography charges from Kansas and also for contracting without a license. Storey is currently in the Washoe County jail awaiting extradition back to Kansas.

The NSCB is committed to protecting homeowners in Nevada and ensuring that contractors are properly licensed before they enter a homeowner's property.

Contracting without a license in Nevada is a misdemeanor for the first offense, a gross misdemeanor for the second offense and a Class E felony for the third offense.

Homeowners should not use unlicensed contractors because their work is

generally poor quality, they are often uninsured and may not maintain workman's compensation coverage for their employees, and the homeowner may be liable for all injuries to workers.

Homeowners who use unlicensed contractors are not eligible for the Residential Recovery Fund, and by law their contracts are null and void.

The NSCB urges consumers to follow these simple tips when dealing with a contractor:

- Hire only licensed contractors. Ask to see the license.
- Don't rush into decisions or hire without checking out potential contractors.
- Be especially wary when approached by someone offering home improvements door-to door.
- Verify the contractor's licensed by checking online at www.nscb.state.nv.us or via automated phone service at (702) 486-1100 (Southern Nevada), or (775) 688-1141 (Northern Nevada).
- Ensure the contractor is properly licensed for the work you want done on your home.
- Limit the amount of your down payment or deposit to 10 percent of the total contract.
- Don't pay cash without obtaining signed receipts, and don't let the payments get ahead of the work.
