## **GOVERNOR MAKES TWO APPOINTMENTS TO CONTRACTORS BOARD**

**HENDERSON, Nev.** –Governor Sandoval has announced the appointment of Jan B. Leggett and the reappointment of Stephen P. Quinn to the Nevada State Contractors Board (NSCB) effective Nov. 19, 2012 thru Oct. 31, 2015. Leggett is replacing former board member Nathaniel “Nat” W. Hodgson, III. The board is comprised of seven members, six licensed contractors and one representative of the public.

He is chairman of the City of Las Vegas Building and Safety Enterprise Fund Advisory Committee and served as vice chairman of the City of Las Vegas Planning Commission.
