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CONTRACTORS BOARD REVOKES LICENSES

HENDERSON and RENO, Nev. – The Nevada State Contractors Board took action against several licensed contractors for violations of Nevada Revised Statutes Chapter 624 during its October hearings in Henderson and Reno.

Scott Meek & Son Concrete Co., license number 23322 (concrete contracting), based out of Reno, Nev., was found in violation for failure to pay for materials or services rendered and failure to establish financial responsibility. The license was revoked. Licensee was fined \$1,500 and assessed investigative costs.

Innovative Outdoor Living and Hardscapes, LLC, license number 78036 (residential and small commercial), based out of Sparks, Nev., was found in violation for abandonment of a construction project without legal excuse, acting in the capacity of a contractor beyond the scope of the license, and failure to establish financial responsibility. The license was revoked. Licensee was fined \$1,750, assessed investigative costs, and ordered to pay restitution in the amount of \$20,000.

Custom Design Cabinets of Las Vegas, license number 51576 (finish carpentry), based out of Las Vegas, Nev., was found in violation for substandard workmanship, failure to take appropriate corrective action, failure to comply with a written request from the Board, and failure to establish financial responsibility. The license was revoked. Licensee was fined \$1,250, assessed investigative costs, and ordered to pay restitution in the amount of \$9,400.

Advanced Lighting & Electric, Inc., license numbers 78258 (erecting signs) and 68333 (electrical contracting), based out of Henderson, Nev., was found in violation for failure to notify the Board of a change in personnel or address within 30 days of the change. License number 78258 was voluntarily surrendered. Licensee has 30 days of the hearing to pay fines of \$500 and investigative costs or license number 68333 will be suspended.

D.C. Stone, LLC, license number 78758 (finishing floors), based out of Las Vegas, Nev., was found in violation for aiding or abetting, combining or conspiring with, allowing a licensed to be used by, and acting as an agent, partner, or associate of an unlicensed person. Licensee was fined \$2,000 and assessed investigative costs. The license limit was reduced to \$10,000.

Tommy Li, owner, dba T&L Stone Design & Remodeling, license number 77778 (finish carpentry) and **Tommy Li, owner, dba T&L Stone**, license numbers 67842 (tiling) and 77510 (install terrazzo and marble), based out of Las Vegas, Nev., was found in violation for substandard workmanship, failure to include the monetary license limit or license number on a contract or proposal, willful disregard of the state's building laws, contracting beyond the scope of the license, and failure to establish financial responsibility. Licensee was fined \$2,050 and assessed investigative costs. The license limit for license number 67842 was reduced to \$10,000.

1st Choice Storage Solutions, license numbers 54686 (carpentry) and 59785 (painting), based out of Scottsdale, Ariz., was found in violation for lending a license to an unauthorized person who is not on the license, aiding or abetting an unlicensed contractor, and failure to establish financial responsibility. The license was revoked. Licensee was assessed investigative costs.

The Nevada State Contractors Board is committed to protecting the public's health, safety, and welfare through licensing and regulation of the construction industry. Under Nevada Revised Statutes, a licensee is subject to disciplinary action by the Board for failure to comply with the requirements of the laws or regulations governing contractors. Violations may result in Board action against the contractor's license. The State Contractors Board has the power to regulate contractors and discipline licensees who violate NRS 624. Disciplinary action may consist of a fine of up to \$10,000 per offense, order corrective action, suspension, revocation or other action.

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
