CONTRACTORS BOARD REVOKES EIGHT LICENSES AT MAY HEARINGS

RENO and HENDERSON, Nev. – The Nevada State Contractors Board took action against several licensed contractors for violations of Nevada Revised Statutes Chapter 624 during its May hearings in Reno and Henderson.

Silver State Marble, LLC, license numbers 62776 (tiling) and 62894 (install terrazzo & marble), based out of Las Vegas, Nev., stipulated to the revocation of its licenses.

Francis H. Steiner, Owner, dba Nevada Sign, license number 45966 (erecting signs), based out of Henderson, Nev., was found in violation for willful disregard of the building laws of the state. Licensee was fined \$1,000 and assessed investigative costs. Failure of the licensee to pay the fines and costs within the allocated timeframe will result in the license being suspended.

EPCON Electric Nevada, LLC, license number 79838 (electrical contracting), based out of Phoenix, Ariz, was suspended pending the next disciplinary hearing, which was continued for 90 days.

M & M Interiors, LLC, license number 78553 (drywall, sheet metal studs, and acoustical tile), based out of Henderson, Nev., was found in violation for failure to comply with an order of the Board, failure to acquire a business license, failure to include license number or monetary limit in a bid or contract, failure to comply with a written request by the Board, aiding or abetting an unlicensed person, failure to display name and license number on a motor vehicle, and failure to establish financial responsibility. The license was revoked. Licensee was fined \$2,350 and assessed investigative costs.

G Built Construction, LLC, license number 71766 (carpentry) based out of Sparks, Nev., was found in violation for substandard workmanship, failure to take appropriate corrective action, acting beyond the scope of the license, failure to include the Residential Recovery Fund information on a contract or proposal, failure to pay any money due for any materials or services rendered, failure to establish financial responsibility. The license was revoked. Licensee was fined \$2,350 and assessed investigative costs.

Imtiaz Ahmed, dba Lobo Roofing, license number 70178 (roofing) based out of Reno, Nev., was found in violation for substandard workmanship, failure to include the monetary license limit or license number on a contract or proposal, failure to include the Residential Recovery Fund information on a contract or proposal, and commencing work on a project without obtaining the necessary building permits. Licensee was fined \$2,500 and assessed investigative costs. Failure of the licensee to pay the fines and costs within the allocated timeframe will result in the license being suspended.

Sierra Construction & Development, LLC, dba S C D Framing, license number 71348 (carpentry) based out of Sparks, Nev., was found in violation for substandard workmanship, failure to take appropriate corrective action, failure to include the Residential Recovery Fund information on a contract or proposal, failure to pay for materials or services, lending the license to an unauthorized individual who is not on the license, failure to prosecute a construction project or operation thereby causing material injury to another, diversion of funds, and failure to establish financial responsibility. The license was revoked. Licensee was fined \$10,150 and assessed investigative costs.

Sierra Development, license number 68759 (residential & small commercial) based out Sparks, Nev., was found in violation for substandard workmanship, failure to take appropriate corrective action, failure to include the Residential Recovery Fund information on a contract or proposal, failure to pay for materials or services, lending the license to an

unauthorized individual who is not on the license, and failure to establish financial responsibility. The license was revoked. Licensee was fined \$7,600 and assessed investigative costs.

Knighon Construction, LLC, license number 11802A (residential & small commercial) based out of Sparks, Nev., was found in violation for substandard workmanship, failure to complete a construction project in accordance with the plans and specifications, failure to complete a construction project or operation for the price stated in the contract, and failure to establish financial responsibility. The license was revoked. Licensee was fined \$2,000 and assessed investigative costs.

Millhouse Repair, LLC, license numbers 75322 (carpentry) and 76249 (roofing & siding) based out of Spring Creek, Nev., was found in violation for acting beyond the scope of the license, failure to include the Residential Recovery Fund information on a contract or proposal, failure to notify the Board of a change in personnel or address within 30 days, failure to include the monetary license limit or license number on a contract or proposal, failure to keep in force a bond or cash deposit, and failure to establish financial responsibility. The licenses were revoked. Licensee was fined \$2,450 and assessed investigative costs.

Jordan River Construction, Inc., license number 77295 (carpentry) based out of Spring Creek, Nev., was found in violation for substandard workmanship, failure to take appropriate corrective action, willful disregard of the building laws of the state, committing a fraudulent or deceitful act, failure to respond to a written request from the Board, failure to prosecute a construction project or operation thereby causing material injury to another, diversion of funds, acting beyond the scope of the license, advising construction projects beyond the scope of the license, and failure to establish financial responsibility. The license was revoked. Licensee was fined \$16,000 and assessed investigative costs.

The Nevada State Contractors Board is committed to protecting the public's health, safety, and welfare through licensing and regulation of the construction industry. Under Nevada Revised Statutes, a licensee is subject to disciplinary action by the Board for failure to comply with the requirements of the laws or regulations governing contractors. Violations may result in Board action against the contractor's license. The State Contractors Board has the power to regulate contractors and discipline licensees who violate NRS 624. Disciplinary action may consist of a fine of up to \$10,000 per offense, order corrective action, suspension, revocation or other action.

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
