**NSCB Investigators Cite Three Contractors
In Southern Nevada For Alleged Unlicensed Activity**

Nevada State Contractors Board investigators conducted a sting operation on Feb.12, 2008, in the Summerlin area where three contractors were given misdemeanor citations for alleged unlicensed contracting activities.

Those who received criminal citations and ordered to appear in court for allegedly *contracting without a license* by submitting bids were:

Angel Rodriguez , dba Tropical Landscaping, landscaping, *contracting without a license*; **Jose Islas**, dba Islas Lawn Service, landscaping, prior complaint on file, *contracting without a license*; and **Michael Montano**, dba Bob the Waterman, submitted a bid for a water softener and installation of the product, *contracting without a license*.

Contracting without a license in Nevada is a misdemeanor for the first offense, a gross misdemeanor for the second offense and a Class E felony for the third offense.

Homeowners should not use unlicensed contractors because their work is generally poor quality, they are often uninsured and may not maintain workman's

compensation coverage for their employees and the homeowner may be liable for all injuries to workers.

Homeowners who use unlicensed contractors are not eligible for the Residential Recovery Fund, and by law their contracts are null and void.
